Her stage portrayal of Annie Sullivan in *The Miracle Worker* won the Tony Award for Best Lead Actress in 1959. She reprised the role for the 1962 film of the same name, winning the Oscar for Best Actress, but was perhaps best known as Mrs. Robinson in *The Graduate* (1967). Her extensive television work included numerous roles in movies and series, including *Deep in My Heart* (1999), for which she won an Emmy for Best Supporting Actress. A filmography/videography and information about DVD availability are included.

Gene Hackman - Peter Shelley 2018-11-30

Gene Hackman (b. 1930) has been described as the best actor of his generation. During almost half a century as an American film, television and stage actor, film producer and author, he was nominated for five Academy Awards, winning the Best Actor for *The French Connection* (1971) and the Best Supporting Actor for *Unforgiven* (1992), as well as three Golden Globes and two BAFTAs.
