*Perpetuity of family-owned business in the Philippines* - Alain Marc P. Golez 2015

The purpose of this study is to establish a causal model that would explain the perpetuity of family-owned businesses considering the influence of a combination of both external and internal factors in the enabling environments. The study used the mixed method as a means of collecting the needed data to attain the objectives of the study. According to the appropriate method based on Creswel and Clark (2007), mixed method combines the use of quantitative and qualitative approaches, providing a better understanding of research problems that either of the approaches alone could not suffice. A total of 1117 business owners/members took part in the study from the ten major cities of the Philippines. The findings of the study showed that, perpetuity is influenced by ecological and political factors among the external factors. On the other hand, innovation, succession planning, and family stability were the strongest influencing internal factors of perpetuity. Using the structural equation modeling, the causal model established that when both external and internal factors were taken together as one, the causal model established that perpetuity is an effect of innovation and innovation is an effect of the confluence of other family business internal factors. Perpetuity is ensured if innovation is sustained through the consistent adherence to of family constitution, family stability, succession plan and productivity based management.
