IN WHAT MAY BE THE BEST ANALYSIS OF HOW INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AFFECTED ANY DOMESTIC ISSUE, MARY DUDZIAK INTERPRETS POSTWAR CIVIL RIGHTS AS A COLD WAR FEATURE. SHE ARGUES THAT THE COLD WAR HELPED FACILITATE KEY SOCIAL REFORMS, INCLUDING DESEGREGATION. BUT THE STORY IS ALSO ONE OF PEOPLE: AN AFRICAN-AMERICAN VETERAN OF WORLD WAR II LYNCHED IN GEORGIA; AN ATTORNEY GENERAL FLOODED BY CIVIL RIGHTS PETITIONS FROM ABROAD; THE TEENAGERS WHO DESEGREGATED LITTLE ROCK'S CENTRAL HIGH; AFRICAN DIPLOMATS DENIED RESTAURANT SERVICE; BLACK ARTISTS LIVING IN EUROPE AND SUPPORTING THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT FROM OVERSEAS; CONSERVATIVE POLITICIANS VIEWING DESEGREGATION AS A COMMUNIST PLOT; AND CIVIL RIGHTS LEADERS WHO SAW THEIR STRUGGLE ECLIPSED BY VIETNAM. NEVER BEFORE HAS ANY SCHOLAR SO DIRECTLY CONNECTED CIVIL RIGHTS AND THE COLD WAR.
